Alexandra Taveras has performed on stages all around the world with many of the music industry's



most prominent Grammy-award winning and platinum-selling recording artists including: Millie Quezada, Matt Morris, Thalia, Marc Anthony, Chayanne, Alejandro Sanz, Gente De Zona, Jose Luis Pagan, Celia Cruz, Tito Puente and Jennifer Lopez, among others. She is a talented vocalist who has shared her gift for over two decades.

Born on Valentine's Day in the Bronx, New York to first generation Dominican parents, Alexandra knew that she was destined to sing. While she was very aware at a young age that she was blessed with a beautiful voice, her passion for singing was awakened when she attended New York City's High School of Music and Art, which was the subject of the blockbuster movie and television show

"Fame."

She received a scholarship to the prestigious New England Conservatory of Music in Boston, Massachusetts where she was classically trained and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Vocal Performance.

Having the versatility and undisputed vocal talent of singing different genres, Alexandra jumpstarted her career in 1986 as a lead vocalist for a merengue band called The New York Band. Their unique sound, choreography and costumes gained worldwide attention, and they became an international sensation. In 2016 the group reunited for a performance at the globally televised awards show Premios Soberano in the Dominican Republic, where they received the coveted Merit Award.

In addition to touring the world, Alexandra was featured with Salsa giant Tito Nieves on the charttopping duet recording of "How Do You Keep the Music Playing" and lent her vocals on megastar Marc Anthony's album Libre, which landed her a gig as a member and only female of the Marc Anthony Band. In 2002 she signed with Universal Music Latin and recorded her first self-titled solo album, Alexandra Taveras, produced by Grammy-award winner Cucco Peña.

Alexandra has held her own for the last 21 years touring the world with salsa legend Marc Anthony. She is currently in the studio working on her sophomore album and is also one-fourth of the dynamic new Latin contemporary band, A Tempo. Alexandra is on the move with no intention of stopping anytime soon!
